² **Processor Assessment:** The processor assessment is an obligation under the Fluid Milk Promotion Order (7 CFR § 1160.101 et seq.). The Order requires that all persons who process and market commercially more than 3,000,000 pounds of fluid milk products in consumer-type packages in the 48 contiguous States and the District of Columbia on a monthly basis, excluding those fluid milk products delivered to the residence of a consumer, be assessed 20 cents per hundredweight on all marketings of such packaged fluid milk products during the month.

¹ The manufacturing make allowances used to compute the Federal order minimum advanced Class I and Class II prices are based on the manufacturing make allowances used prior to the issuance of the Interim Final Rule published in the Federal Register on December 29, 2006 (71 FR 78333-78335). The United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio enjoined the Department from using the make allowances from the Interim Final Rule in determining the February 2007, advanced Class I and Class II prices. The manufacturing allowances used to compute the Class II butterfat price, Class III and Class IV milk prices for February 2007, as well as future Class Prices will be those contained in the Interim Final Rule.

³ The cheese price is a weighted average of the: (a) NASS 40 lb. block cheese and (b) NASS 500 lb. barrel cheese (38% moisture) plus 3 cents.
