


## **Accelerated Concentration In Top Dairy Counties**

78 Counties Marketed 50% Of All CA + Federal Order Milk During December 2000





U.S. milk marketings are indeed national in scope as illustrated by the milk marketing density map shown on page three. At a glance, the map supports the issue that the "well-being" of the dairy producer and industry streches across the U.S. and is not confined to any one specific geographic area. However one aspect hidden in this national "milkshed" picture is a continued trend toward the concentration of milk supplies. The general agricultural consolidation trend toward fewer and larger farms becomes much more apparent within


the dairy industry by examining where a majority of milk marketings originate. Data for these maps were tabulated based on federal order and California milk marketings per county which were provided by all market administrator offices and the California dairy marketing branch.

Milk marketings from 78 counties accounted for 50 percent of the total California and federal order milk marketings during December 2000. These counties are illustrated by the above map. The table at the right illustrates the number of counties which account for 50 percent have also become a statistic of concentration. Just five years earlier, milk from 120 counties accounted for 50 percent of the total milk marketings. The four maps at the top of page two provide a more detailed view of these data based on marketings by county as a

percent of the federal order and California total. There were 2,089 counties with milk marketings during December 2000. The top 14 counties accounted for 25 percent of the marketings. The 78 counties depicted here accounted for 50 percent, while 257 counties represented 75 percent of the total.

The sheer size in marketings from some of the larger counties is illustrated by the map below. Tulare County California marketed more milk than any other county with 656 million pounds in December 2000. The cumulative federal order and California marketings from 1,239 counties (smallest & up) were required to equal the marketings from Tulare County. This comparison points out the growing disparity between so-called "mega-farms" located in concentrated geographic areas and "traditional-farms" spread throughout the rest of the country.




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
