





Prices . . . Have Low Prices Replaced Volatile Prices?




Thirteen graphics have be used in this bulletin for the past three years to illustrate a variety of economic factors affecting dairy farmers.




Federal Order Class I Price (\$2.00 Differential)




Federal Order Class II Price




Federal Order Class III Price




Federal Order Class IV Price




Producer Butterfat Price




Producer & Handler Protein Price




Central Federal Order Statistical Blend Price






Class I Producer Receipts All Federal Milk Orders




Cash Corn - Chicago
