

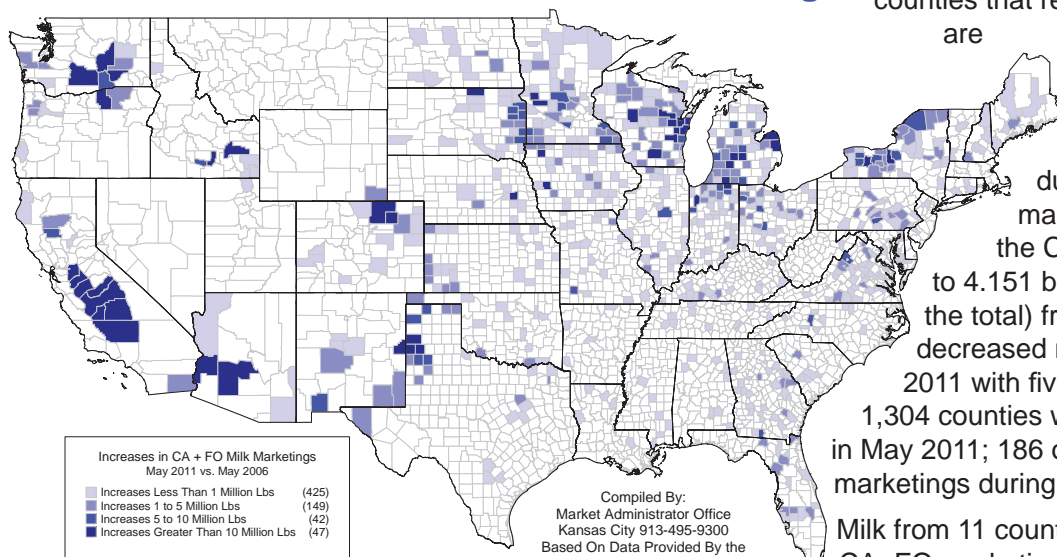

California & Federal Order Milk Marketing Data*

This Bulletin details California & Federal order milk marketings by county for May 2011 and includes comparisons with May 2006. The top map on this page depicts counties with CA+FO marketing increases compared with five years earlier, while counties that reported decreased marketings are portrayed in the lower map.

663 Counties Increased Marketings



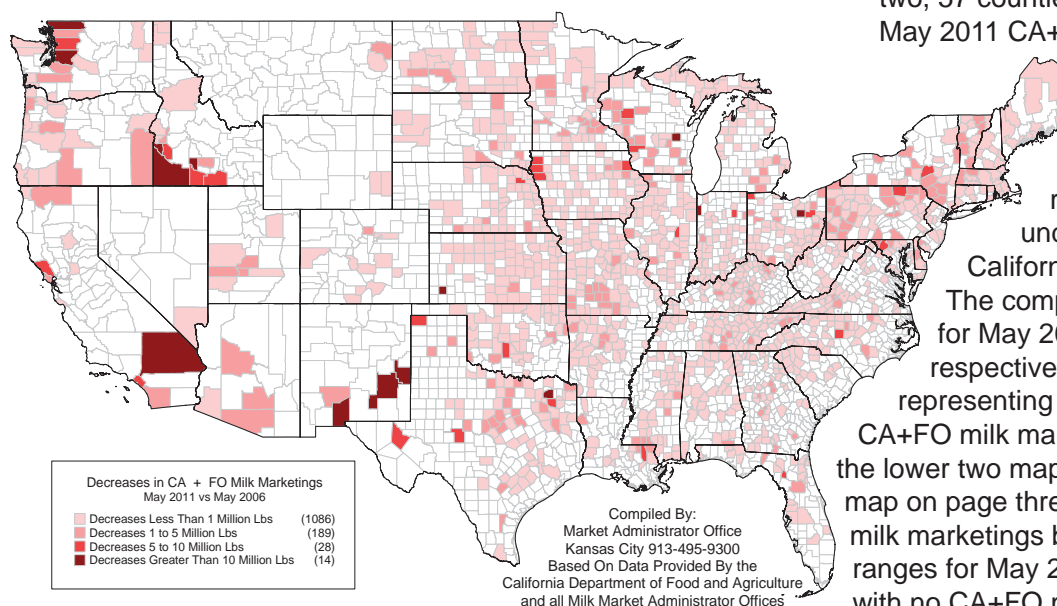

Milk marketings from 663 counties with increases totaled 10.913 billion pounds during May 2011. These marketings represent 72.44% of the CA+FO total. This compares to 4.151 billion pounds (27.56% of the total) from 1,317 counties that decreased marketings, comparing May 2011 with five years earlier. There were 1,304 counties with no CA+FO marketings in May 2011; 186 of these counties had marketings during May 2006.

marketing 25% are located in California, with Tulare (CA) county's 994.4 million pounds leading the way. Marketings from this county represent 6.60% of the CA+FO May 2011 total. To put this in perspective, it requires the combined marketings of 1,237 counties with the lowest marketings to surpass the Tulare county total. The 11 counties that represent 25% of the CA+FO total for May 2011 are depicted in the top left map on page two.

Milk from 11 counties accounted for 25% of all CA+FO marketings during May 2011, which is a decrease of one county from the number during May 2006. Seven of the top 11 counties

1,317 Counties Decreased Marketings



As indicated by the top right map on page two, 57 counties marketed 50% of the May 2011 CA+FO total, down from 65 counties in May 2006.

In May 2011 a total of 193 counties marketed 75% of the total 1,794 counties reporting milk marketings under the Federal order and California state order programs. The comparable number of counties for May 2006 were 220 and 1,925, respectively. The counties representing 75% and 100% of CA+FO milk marketings are depicted in the lower two maps on page two. The map on page three details CA+FO milk marketings by selected size ranges for May 2011, while counties with no CA+FO milk marketings are depicted in the map on the last page of this bulletin.

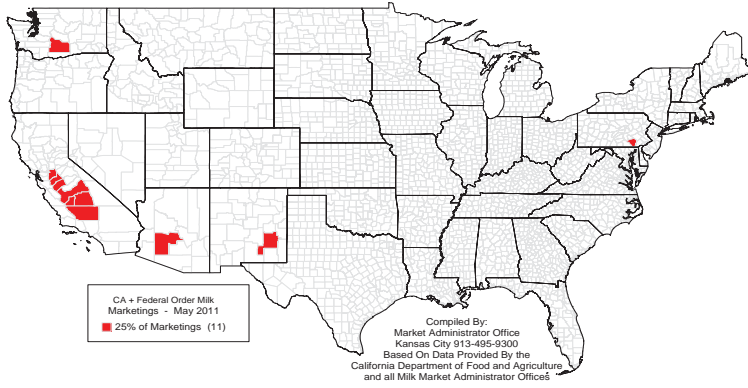
* The Western order was terminated April 1, 2004, resulting in a significant volume of milk in Idaho and Utah no longer being included in this data series.

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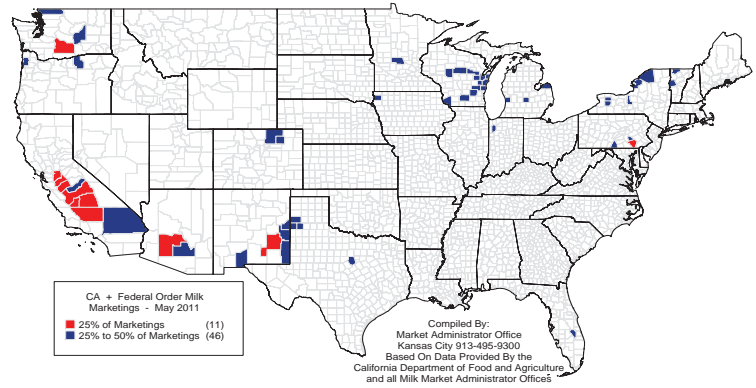
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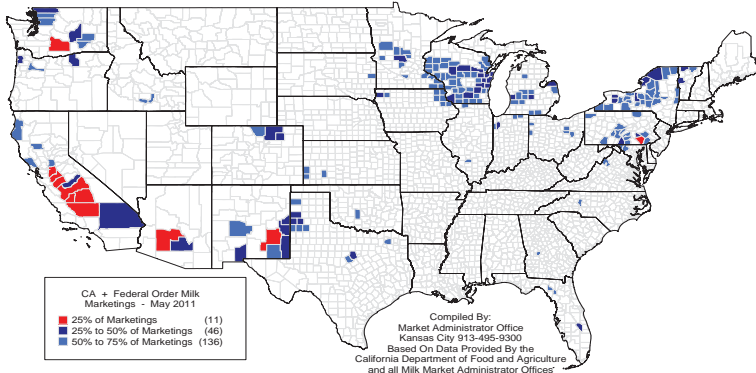
**11 Counties Marketed 25% of All
CA + Federal Order Milk During May 2011**



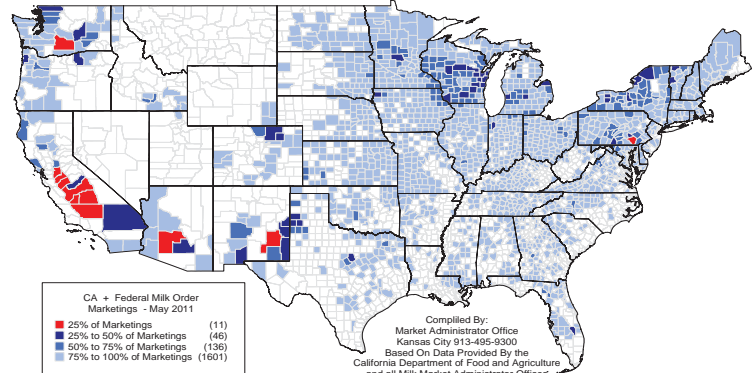
**57 Counties Marketed 50% Of All

CA + Federal Order Milk During May 2011**



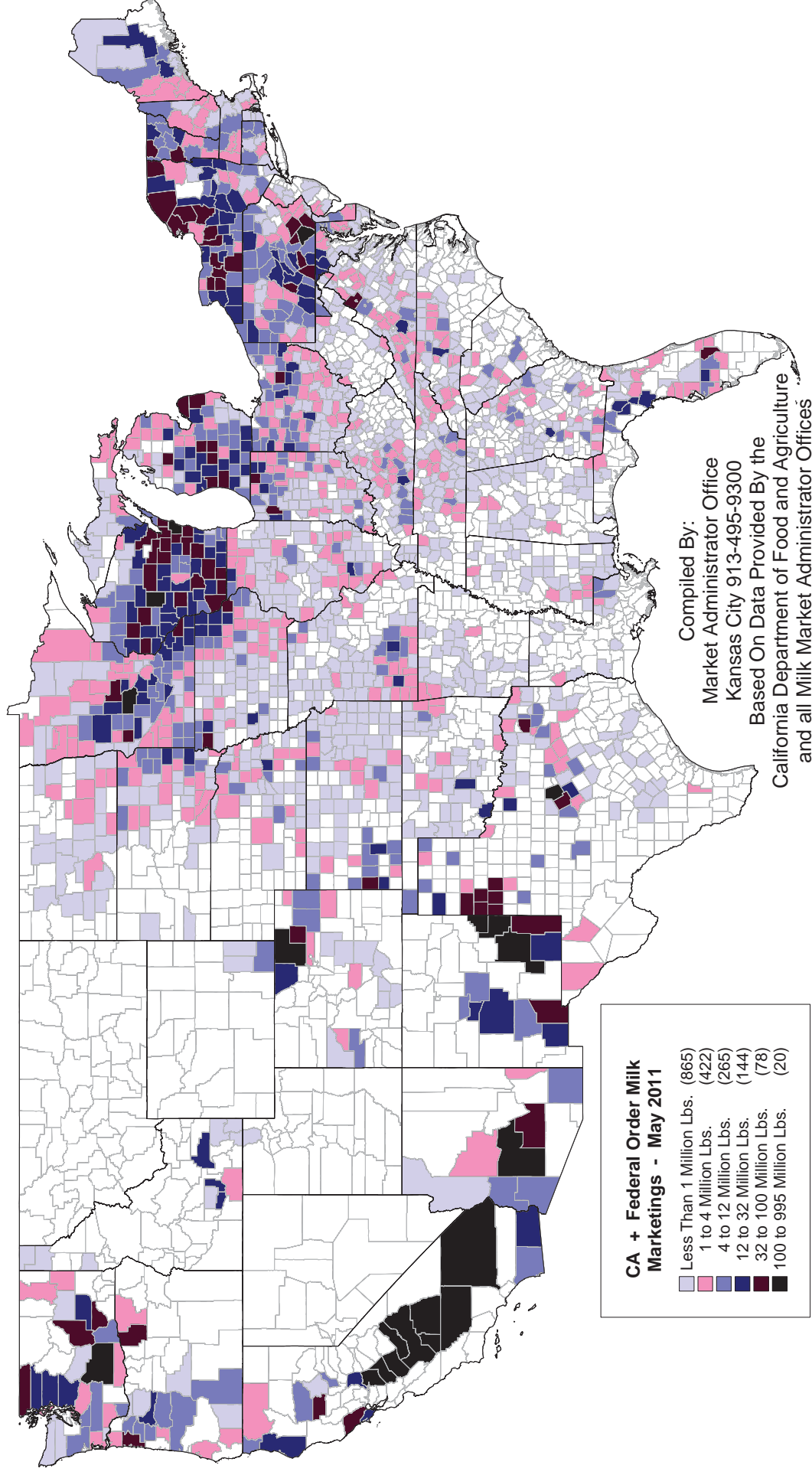

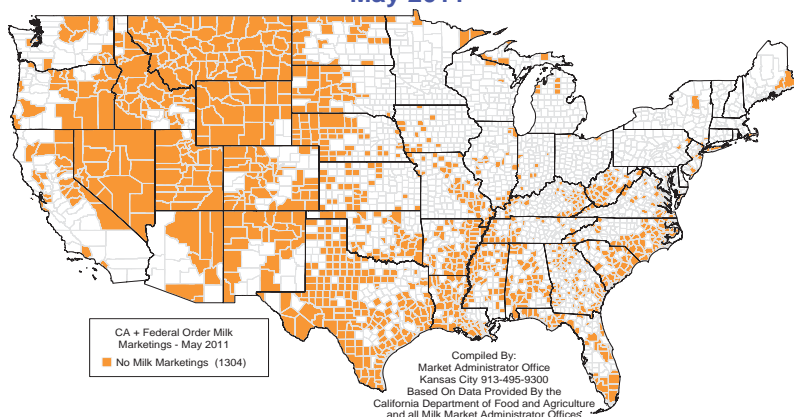
