


This Bulletin details California & Federal order milk marketings by county for **May 2015** and

includes comparisons with May 2010. The top map on this page depicts counties with CA+FO marketing increases compared with five years earlier, while counties that reported decreased marketings are portrayed in the lower map.

Milk marketings from 834 counties with increases totaled 12.989 billion pounds during May 2015. These marketings represent 79.80% of the CA+FO total. This compares to 3.288 billion pounds (20.20% of the total) from 1,035 counties that decreased marketings, comparing May 2015 with five years earlier. There were 1,406 counties with no CA+FO marketings in May 2015; 174 of these counties had marketings during May 2010.


Milk from twelve counties accounted for 25% of all CA+FO marketings during May 2015, which is the same number of counties that marketed 25% during May 2010. Seven of the top twelve counties are located in California, with Tulare (CA) county's 1.003 billion pounds leading the way. Marketings from this county represent 6.16% of the CA+FO May 2015 total. To put this in perspective, it requires the combined marketings of 1,165 counties with the lowest marketings to surpass the Tulare county



1,035 Counties Decreased Marketings


total. The twelve counties that represent 25% of the CA+FO total for May 2015 are depicted in the top left map on page two.

As indicated by the top right map on page two, 58 counties marketed 50% of the May 2015 CA+FO total, down from 61 counties in May 2010. In May 2015 a total of 186 counties marketed 75% of the CA+FO total, while 1,693 counties had milk marketings under either the Federal order or California state order programs. The comparable number of counties for May 2010 were 199 and 1,804, respectively. The counties representing 75% and 100% of CA+FO milk marketings are depicted in the lower two maps on page two. The map on page three details CA+FO milk marketings by selected size ranges for May 2015, while counties with no CA+FO milk marketings are depicted in the map on the last page of this bulletin.


