while counties that reported decreased marketings are portrayed in the lower map.

Milk marketings from 845 counties with increases totaled 11.502 billion pounds during May 2016. These marketings represent 69.47% of the CA+FO total. This compares to 5.055 billion pounds (30.53% of the total) from 1,003 counties that decreased marketings, comparing May 2016 with five years earlier. There were 1,446 counties with no CA+FO marketings in May 2016; 193 of these counties had marketings during May 2011.

Milk from 13 counties accounted for 25% of all CA+FO marketings during May 2016, which is an increase of two from the 11 counties that marketed 25% during May 2011. Seven of the top 13 counties are located in California, with Tulare (CA) county's 973 billion pounds leading the way. Marketings from this county represent 5.88% of the CA+FO May 2016 total. To put this in perspective, it requires the combined marketings of 1,128 counties with the lowest marketings to surpass the Tulare county




total. The 13 counties that represent 25% of the CA+FO total for May 2016 are depicted in the top left map on page two.

As indicated by the top right map on page two, 60 counties marketed 50% of the May 2016 CA+FO total, up from 57 counties in May 2011. In May 2016 a total of 185 counties marketed 75% of the CA+FO total, while 1,655 counties had milk marketings under either the Federal order or California state order programs. The comparable number of counties for May 2011 were 193 and 1,794, respectively. 
13 Counties Marketed 25% of All CA + Federal Order Milk During May 2016




60 Counties Marketed 50% of All CA + Federal Order Milk During May 2016



185 Counties Marketed 75% of All CA + Federal Order Milk During May 2016






