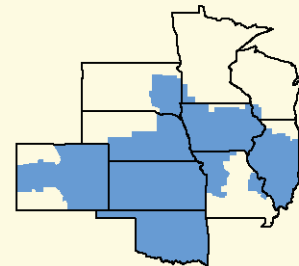

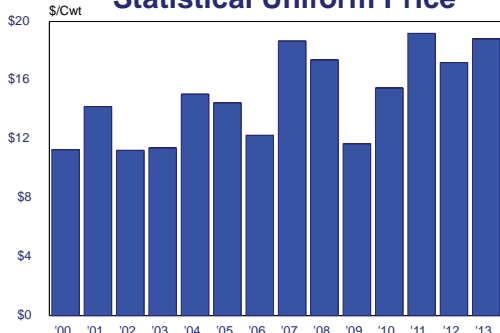

Central Order Data : How Did 2013 Measure Up ?

Statistical Uniform Price

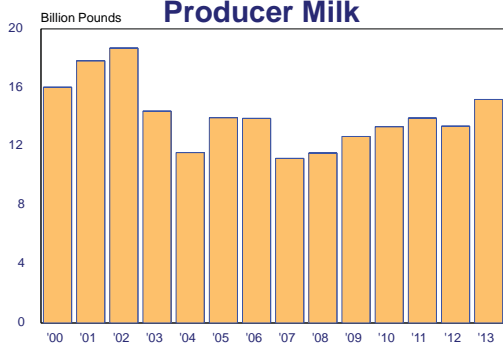


Central Order producer prices, as measured by the statistical uniform price, registered a moderate increase in 2013 compared with the previous year. The 2013 weighted average statistical uniform price for the Central Order was \$18.82 per cwt., a 9.36% increase from 2012's \$17.21 average. Since implementation of Federal Order reform in 2000, the annual statistical uniform price has averaged \$14.88, ranging from a low of \$11.24 in 2002 to the high of \$19.19 in 2011. The weighted average Producer Price Differential (PPD) for 2013 was \$0.83 per cwt., which is \$0.73 more than the 2012 average, and \$0.20 above the post-reform average of \$0.63 per cwt.



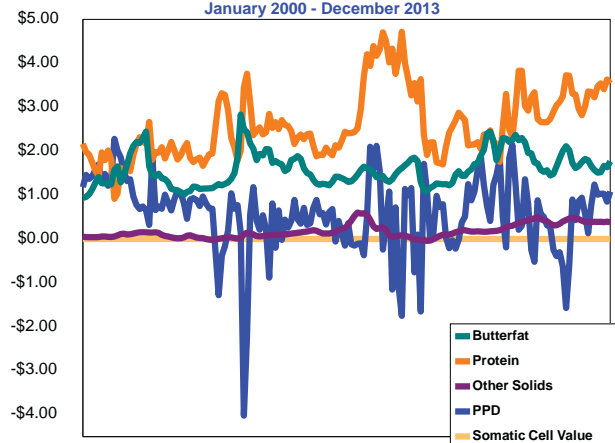
Producer marketings on the Central Order averaged 1.267 billion pounds per month during 2013, for a total of 15.199 billion pounds. This total is up 13.52% from 2012, but is 18.72% less than the record 18.700 billion pounds marketed during 2002.

Producer Milk



Central Order marketings were the 4th highest among all federal orders in 2013, trailing the Upper Midwest, Northeast, and Mideast Orders. The top right graph on page 3 depicts producer marketing data by order.

Monthly component prices for the last 14 years are depicted by graphs on page 2. Compared with the previous year, the 2013 protein price average increased by 8.49%, while the other solids average price decreased by 0.84% and the average butterfat price decreased by 3.46%. Average Central Order per pound producer component prices, along with per hundredweight PPD and statistical uniform prices, are detailed in the table on this page.

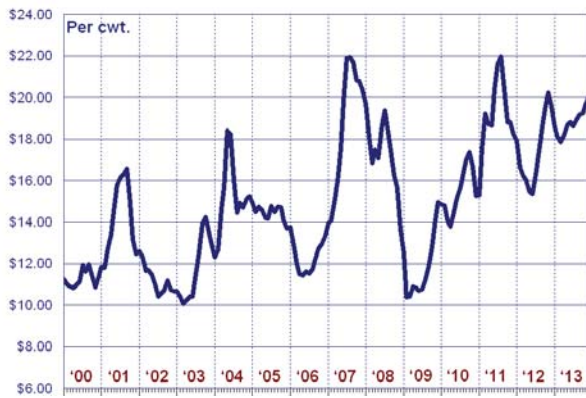

Class I utilization for the Central Order was 32.02% of producer receipts in 2013. The lowest annual utilization was recorded in 2002 at 26.02%, while Class I utilization peaked in 2007 at 38.82%. Central Order Class I utilization during 2013 ranked 7th among the 10 federal milk orders. Class I utilization percentages for all orders are depicted in the lower left graph on page 3.

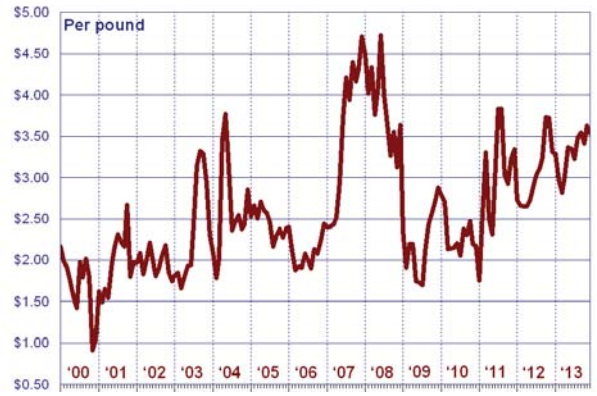

Producer Price Differential



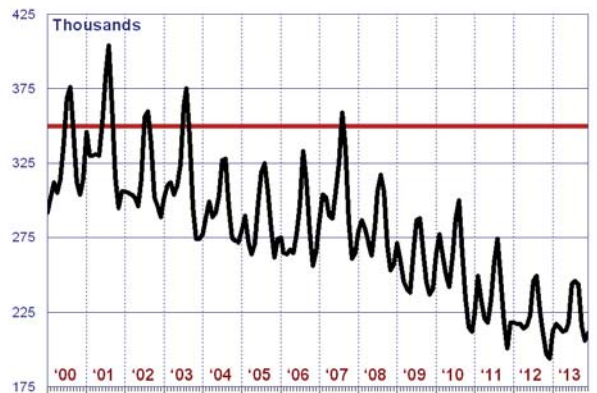
Producer Butterfat Price



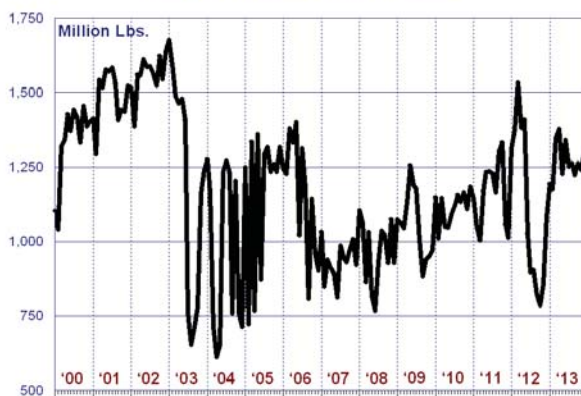
Producer Other Solids Price



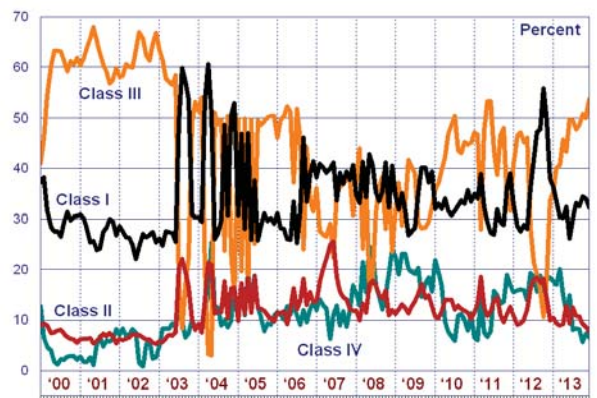
Avg. Somatic Cell Count In Producer Milk



Total Producer Milk Pooled

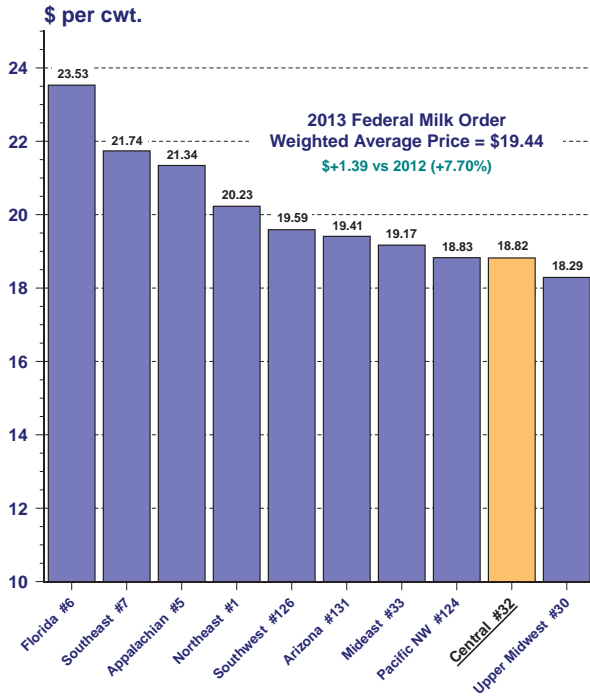


Utilization Of Producer Milk By Class



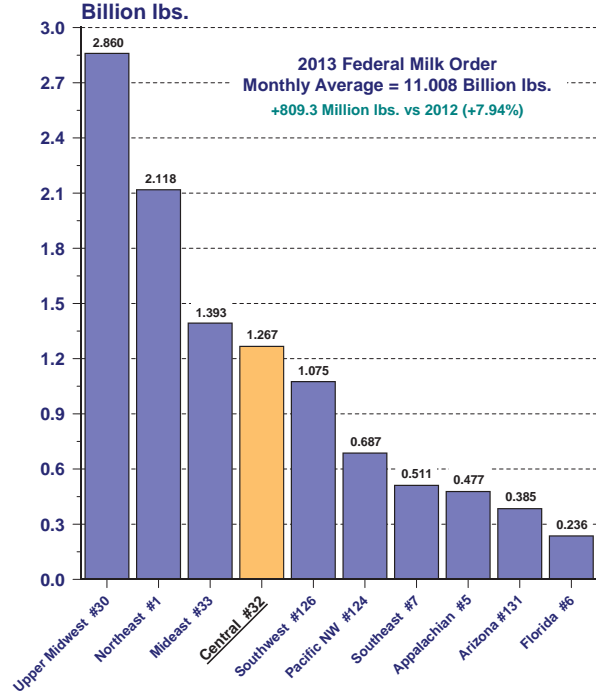

2013 Producer Receipts

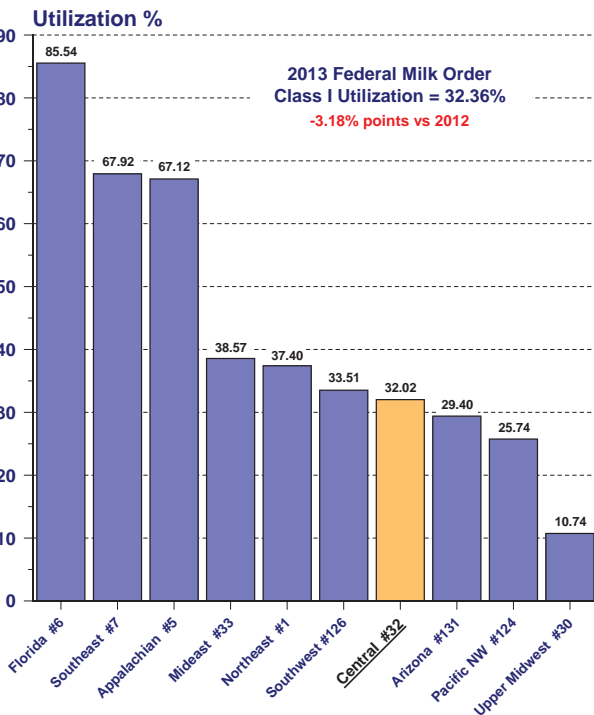
Monthly Average By Federal Milk Order

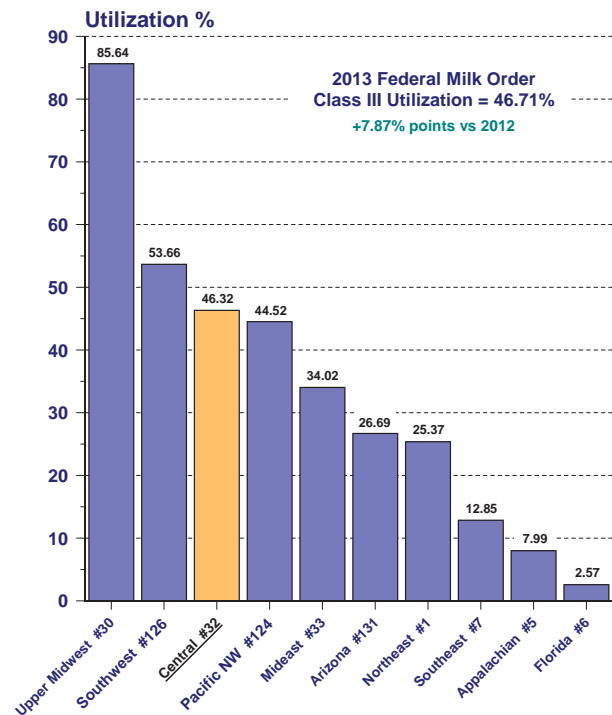
2013 Class I Utilizations
